October 29 at 6 pm

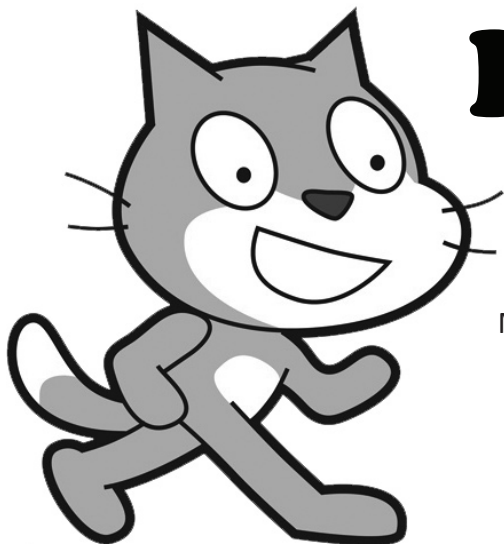
