Onondaga County Park passes can be used at county parks like Highland Forest, Jamesville Beach, and the Zoo. The library also offers limited free park passes to the Stone Quarry Art Park.

Fine Free for Veterans

Manlius veterans and active-duty military personnel will no longer be charged late fines for overdue Manlius Library items. Show your ID at the front desk to have your library account updated with the new privileges. The new policy applies to Manlius Library patrons and materials only. If materials are 30 days overdue, the patron's account will be blocked from library services. After 60 days, the account will be charged a replacement fee for the item.
