Manlius Library stepped up outreach and community involvement in 2016. Staffed raised \$2,100 in support of the F-M Relay for Life and participated in events like Wicked Woods, the NYS Fair, and the Fayetteville Farmer's Market.

The library became a donation site for non-profits collecting coats and diapers for families in need. The library also established a new free book nook at the F-M Community Outreach and Food Pantry, where 1,000 adult and kids books have been given to local families.

A newly installed Storywalk around the swan pond put a picture book on-the-go, encouraging little readers to count squirrels and ducks. Three new CNYFi internet kits were deployed in 2016 so Manlius patrons can now check out a 4G hotspot and bring the internet home.

Dr. Harold and Barbara Jones of Manlius expanded the library's Audubon collection in 2016 with 10 historical pieces and further donated two Salvador Dali swan-themed prints. In 2016, Manlius Library hosted 10 professional art & photography exhibits in addition to art by local students.

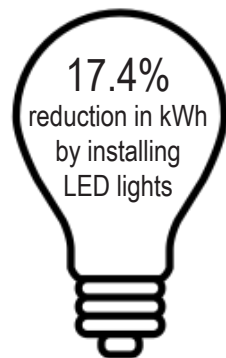

## Kids & Teens

In 2016, we welcomed a new Young Adult Services Librarian, Lorie Finger, to lead a focus on teen services, including a new Teen Advisory Board and expanded programming.

Our most popular program for kids & teens, Harry Potter Day, was attended by over 250 people and nearly 200 people enjoyed Fire Safety Day with the Manlius Fire Department!

Thanks to a NYS Construction grant and in response patron feedback we were able to renovate the children's area for safety, staff efficiency, and family-friendly spaces to read, play, and interact.

In 2016, over 22,470 attendees came to 830 childrens programs and over 580 attendees came to 64 programs for teens

## Story Time

In 13 weekly story times

1,798 babies & their caregivers learned social skills, developed language, and had important bonding experiences;

4,025 toddlers & their caregivers shared stories, rhymes, movement and songs, promoting early literacy and language skills;

5,213 preschool-aged kids & their caregivers heard stories, made crafts, prepared for kindergarten; and

746 kids attended afterschool and evening story times.

Miss Karen visited 496 kids at F-M schools and daycares.

## Adult Programs

2016 was full of exciting programming for adults, providing the opportunity to watch a movie or a screening from the Lincoln Center, join a book club or writing group, discuss current events, hear about history, learn a new skill and more!

Over 1,100 people engaged in Manlius Informed and Great Decisions lecture series while nearly 350 people improved their technology skills through classes and scheduled one-on-one help sessions.
