For Your Safety:

• All items must be returned to the outside book drop. Please contact us if you have an item checked out which cannot be returned in the book drop (e-readers, Rokus, etc).

• All items are being placed into quarantine for a minimum of 7 days before they will be checked in and removed from your card, for the safety of staff and patrons alike.

• Masks are required, covering both nose and mouth, when using the library during open hours and curbside pickup.

• Fines will not be assessed during this time. Items that are not returned within 60 days past their due date will be marked as lost, and the full replacement fee for the item will be charged.

• We are not accepting material donations at this time.


