What do I need to sign up for a library card?

You will need a valid ID as well as proof of your address to get a library card. Stop by the library to fill out an application and pick up your card.



If you are at least 13 years old, you can begin your library card application online. When you register online, you will receive a temporary barcode number that you can use to request materials and access eContent. To receive your permanent library card, visit any branch member of the Onondaga County Public Library system and verify your current address with a picture ID

or two other forms of ID. Once you have your permanent card, you can check out items.

If you are under the age of 13 years old, you will need to fill out your application in person at the front desk. A parent or legal guardian must register for a card with a child under 8, and is responsible for any fines incurred on the child's card.
