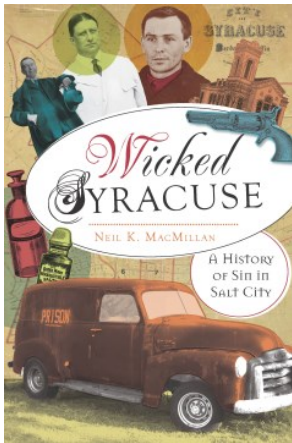




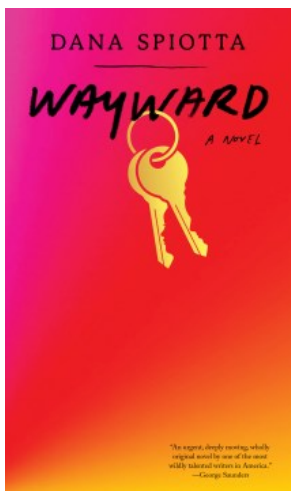

by Neil MacMillan

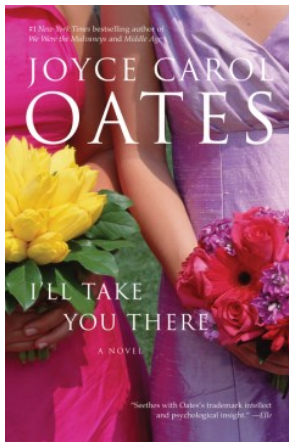

by Shari Lapena

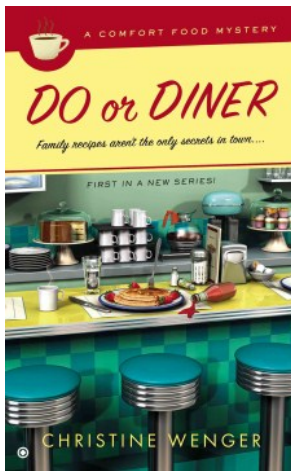

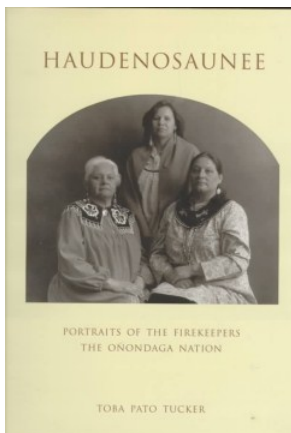

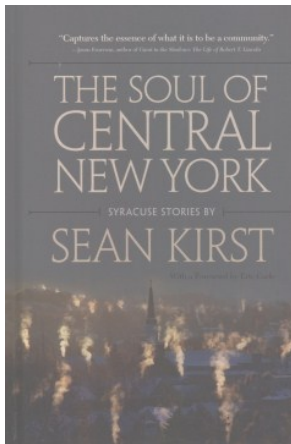
